

Lazaros Kyrizoglou

Born in Tsakoni, Kastoria, to a farming family, Lazaros Kyrizoglou attended Nestoriou High School and Kastoria Lyceum.

He holds a Law Degree from Aristotle University of Thessaloniki (1978) and completed his military service in the Greek Army (1978-1981). He worked as a lawyer at the Supreme Court of Greece (Areios Pagos).

At 26, he was elected Municipal Councilor of Ampelokipi (1982). He ran for Mayor of Ampelokipi in 1986 and 1990, achieving high vote percentages. From 1991 to 1993, he served as Prefect of Euboea, where he was recognized for his achievements in project implementation.

In 2002, he was elected Mayor of Ampelokipi (58%), re-elected in 2006 (50.3%), and then in 2010 (54.39%) as Mayor of Ampelokipi-Menemeni.

He served for eight years as Vice President of the Institutions and Transparency Committee of the Central Union of Greek Municipalities (KEDE).

He continued to be re-elected as Mayor of Ampelokipi-Menemeni in 2014 (53.18%) and 2019 (70%). In 2023, he won with 82% of the vote, marking his 6th consecutive term.

In July 2023, he was elected President of KEDE (Central Union of Greek Municipalities).
